Social Networks & Privacy

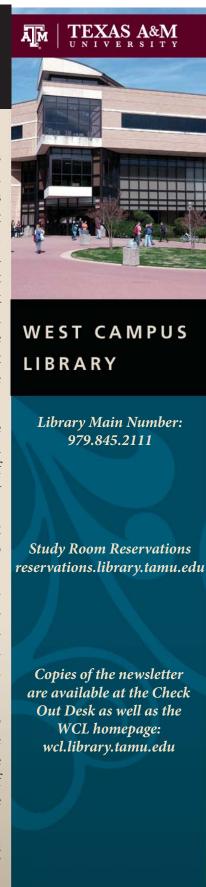
