### Animal Evacuation Shelters

### Animal Rescue

To look for lost and found pets, to sign up as a foster home or to volunteer, register at [www.petfinder.com](http://www.petfinder.com).

To report a lost pet or one needing rescue, call 800-HUMANE1.

To locate foster homes for pets, call 800-485-5152.

The Houston Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals (SPCA) team has authorization to rescue animals in Hardin, Orange, Harris, Jefferson, Galveston, Brazoria and Liberty counties. The team can be reached 713-869-7722.
