ORIGINAL UNIT:

The 42nd Bombardment Squadron was placed on a non-operational status (zero strength) in October 1945, after active participation in World War II. The squadron was assigned to the Twentieth Air Force 23 April 1946\*, and attached to Northwest Field Air Base Command (Provisional) effective 15 May 1946.\*\*

SOURCE OF PERSONNEL STRENGTH:

All officers and enlisted men of the 41st Bombardment Squadron (WH), 501st Bombardment Group (WH), were reassigned to the 42nd Bombardment Squadron, 11th Bombardment Group.\*\*\* In addition, twenty-eight enlisted men were assigned and joined from Headquarters 501st Bombardment<sup>Group</sup>.\*\*\*\* Also fourteen enlisted men were assigned and joined from the 11th Bombardment Group.\*\*\*\*\*

CHANGES IN ORGANIZATION:

The 42nd Bombardment Squadron was classified as Heavy Bombardment Squadron, T/O & E 1-117 and was transferred to Northwest Field Air Base Command (Provisional). This squadron was reclassified under T/O & E 1-167R, Very Heavy (VH) Bombardment Squadron.

STRENGTH (Commissioned and Enlisted)

As of 2400, 20 May 1946, 115 officers and 241 enlisted men.

Net decrease, 1 officer. Net increase, 29 enlisted men.

As of 2400, 31 May 1946, 114 officers, 270 enlisted men.

Net decrease: 38 officers, 87 enlisted men.

As of 2400, 30 Jun 1946, 76 officers, 183 enlisted men.

Net decrease: 11 officers, 24 enlisted men.

As of 2400, 31 Jul 1946 65 officers, 159 enlisted men.

MARCHES:

Negative for May and June. In July a formation of all members of the group was held on the line for the visit of General Whitehead, but the General was not able to attend.

STATIONS:

This organization continues to be located at APO 182.

OPERATIONS:

In May, squadron personnel participated in search missions, which were flown in search of two aircraft (C-54 and B-17) of which neither

were of this organization. Search missions continued during June, but the planes were never located.

During the month of July squadron personnel participated in a routine training mission to Manila for the Fourth of July celebrations.\* The squadron also participated in training missions to Oahu as well as local flights.

DISTINGUISHED SQUADRON PERSONNEL: Negative

SQUADRON AIRPLANES BY TYPES:

No airplanes have been assigned to this squadron. At present the squadron is using twelve Standard Type B-29 aircraft which are assigned to the 11th Bombardment Group (VH).

42ND BOMBARDMENT SQUADRON NARRATIVE

With the remanning of the 42nd Bombardment Squadron,\* the men of this organization were not affected in the slightest way. The men remained in the same area, and no moving at all was necessary. Functions continued at their normal pace and new programs were started without any interruptions by the turnover. Most of the personnel were absorbed from the 41st Bombardment Squadron (VH).\*\* The men in the 501st Bombard Group (VH) Headquarters were transferred to the squadron\*\*\* as well as fourteen enlisted men from a replacement shipment.\*\*\*\* The squadron's Commanding Officer is Major Richard A. House.\*\*\*\*\* The Adjutant is 1st Lt Donald B. Packer.\*\*\*\*\* The Squadron Operations Officer is 1st Lt William R. Sullivan.\*\*\*\*\*

The squadron is far below authorized strength. Losses toward the end of June brought the squadron to a new low. The remaining personnel

have had to take on many additional duties in order to keep the organization running as smoothly as before.

The squadron participated in no operations as an individual unit. The group has not designated squadron airplanes or any type of operation for a squadron to carry out as a unit. However, the personnel of the 42nd Bombardment Squadron have been used in combined operations. The squadron's officers and enlisted men were used extensively as crew members for search missions in May and June as well as for training missions to the Philippines and to Oahu.

Services, supply, and training (except on-the-job) are not squadron functions under the present consolidated organization.

Several improvements were made in the area with the main features being the laundry and hobby shop facilities. A dark room was also built for the enlisted men. The construction of a day room and beer garden was begun in May. The day room opened in June. It stays open weekdays, Sundays, and holidays and dispenses coke, beer, cigars, cigarettes, and sandwiches nightly. Ice cream is made quite often.

A First-Three Graders Committee was organized in May and held weekly meetings to discuss general welfare and administrative problems of the squadron. The original committee included T Sgt Joseph Lynch, S Sgt William S. George, S Sgt John Laberski, S Sgt Leon Poch, and Sgt Nickolas G. Ricos (First Sergeant). In July the committee was changed to the



following: T Sgt Joseph Lynch, T Sgt Robert J. Nori, S Sgt John J. Laberski, and Sgt Salvatore P. Cosimano, the first sergeant.

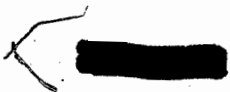
On 28 May 1946, four members of the 42nd Bombardment Squadron were elected to the Board of Directors of the Enlisted Men's Club. The enlisted men representing the squadron were S Sgt William T. McWerney, Sgt Wallace Alexander, Sgt John Woodhouse, and Cpl Claude Brummes. The Directors meet once a month--their purpose being to govern the policy of the club and to insure representation of the squadron.

An athletic program was organized in May for participation of men in the squadron. Basketball, bolleyball, and softball were accentuated on the program. Prizes were offered to the leading teams at various stages of league play. The inaugural game was played under the lights on the squadron court the last of May. Lights on the basketball court were installed by the squadron as an added facility to the athletic program.

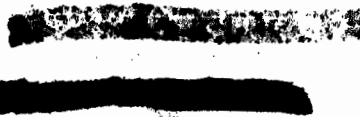

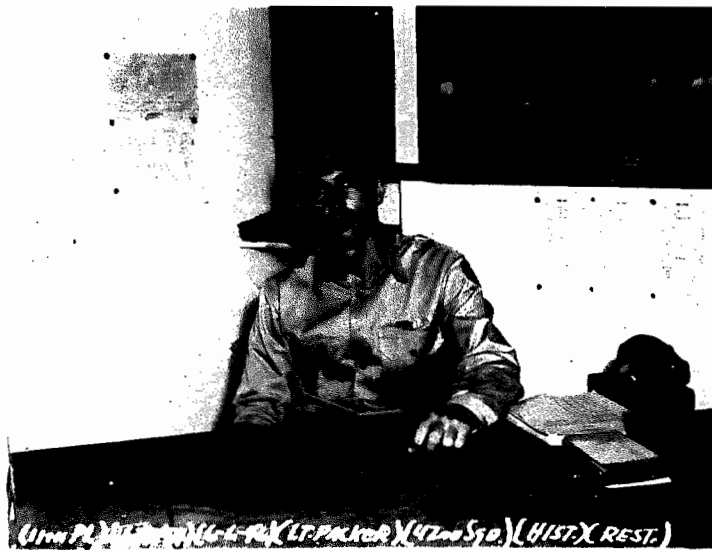

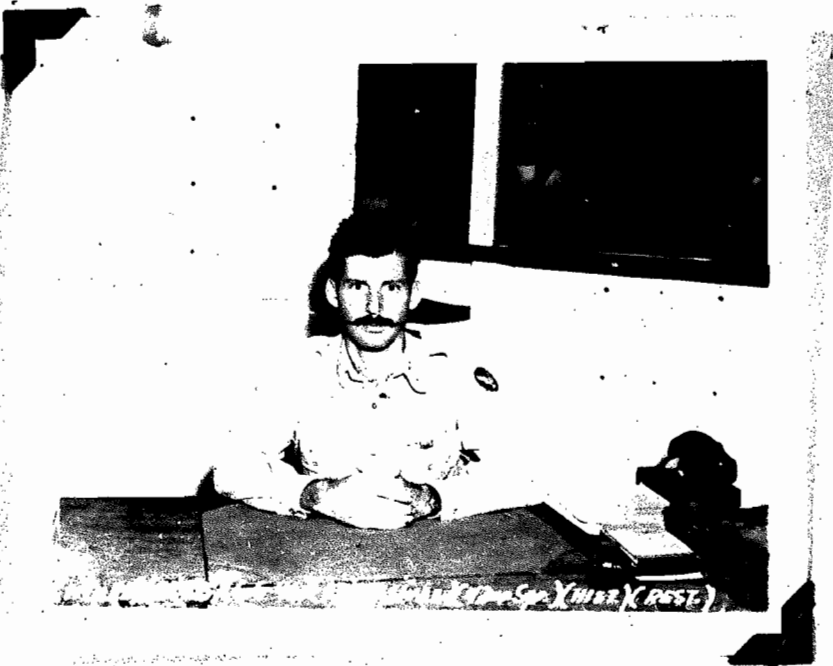

NARRATIVE

Of great importance during the month of August was the flying of altitude missions in conjunction with Operations Crossroads. Whereas the group as a whole participated in the flights, the 42nd Bombardment Squadron furnished many of the crew members. In like manner did the squadron participate in the "Display of Strength" mission over the principle cities of Japan on Air Force Day, 4 August 1946.<sup>1</sup> This mission was staged out of Okinawa. All of the seven aircraft which were sent out, participated in the mission and returned safely. One practice bombing mission to Guguan in the Marianas was flown by the squadron as well as numerous training and transition flights.

Processing of T/O & E vehicles proceeded rapidly during the latter part of August when preliminary arrangements for loading vehicles aboard Oahu bound shipping were made. This was the first real evidence the squadron has had of its anticipated move to Oahu. The squadron is presently using vehicles of inactivated units of this field.

The squadron lost through current readjustment policies its remaining Category V officers during August as well as enlisted men who had from twenty-four months service as of 31 August 1946 to twenty-one months service as of 30 September 1946. Incoming personnel were limited to two officers

and four enlisted men. In spite of its greatly reduced strength, the squadron has maintained its normal functions with some degree of efficiency.

Dependents are beginning to arrive on Guam. Men from the squadron are being detailed to work on dependent housing. At present only one family has arrived, that of the squadron commander, but many more are expected soon.

In line with the program to improve the squadron area, the orderly room was painted, logs were cut and laid as bases for coral walks, trees which were potential typhoon threats were felled, and mirrors were provided for the showerrooms. A circular saw, plainer, and jig saw were added to the squadron Hobby Shop. The squadron Day Room, named "Boondockers' Retreat" in a recent contest, is receiving a coat of white paint. Interior improvements to the Day Room include two large electric fans, a radio, and an ice cream machine which dispenses free ice cream. Two highly successful parties were held in the Day Room in August. Food and refreshments were provided from the squadron fund.

The First-three Graders Committee has been active this month. Three meetings were held at which squadron problems were discussed. Members of the newly elected committee are T Sgt Robert J. Nori, S Sgt James B. Webster, S Sgt Herbert G. Emberton, S Sgt Kenneth M. Keddy, and S Sgt Salvatore P. Cosimano.

Four enlisted men from the squadron, T Sgt Robert J. Nori, Cpl James E. Damon, Pfc Donald A Ruel, and Pfc James E. Wright were members of the baseball team which won the championship of the Marianas. These men departed for Tokyo, 24 August 1946, to participate in the Olympic finals.<sup>1</sup>

There has been no change in the squadron staff: Major Richard A. House, Commanding Officer, 1st Lt Donald B. Packer, Adjutant, and 1st Lt William R. Sullivan, Operations Officer.

42ND BOMBARDMENT SQUADRON NARRATIVE

The squadron was revived by two large shipments during September which more than made up for the number of enlisted men and officers returned to the Zone of the Interior through current readjustment policies. For the first time since May the squadron showed an increase in its strength. There were several changes and additions of key personnel. On the fifth of the month, 1st Lt William R. Sullivan, Squadron Operations Officer, was reassigned, and 1st Lt Eugene Q. Steffes, who joined the squadron from the 75th Air Service Group, took over the duties of Squadron Operations Officer.\* On 19 September 1946, 1st Sgt Roy E. Hauser, newly assigned to the 42nd Squadron, took over the duty of first sergeant. 2nd Lt John A. Thompson was assigned as Assistant Adjutant with other duties of Pay Agent and Squadron Supply Officer. Supply formerly was combined at the group level but now is a squadron function.

The squadron had the misfortune to be in the path of the tropical typhoon "Querida" which struck Guam, 21 September 1946. The evening before, the squadron was alerted for the typhoon, and before the worst of the typhoon (0500) the enlisted personnel were removed from their barracks and moved to the briefing quonset which was relatively safe. No casualties were suffered. Many of the barracks were demolished.\*\*

Material damage was estimated at 40 %; wind speed, at 120 miles per hour. 1st Lt Donald B. Packer, Squadron Adjutant, is being recommended for the Soldiers' Medal for his work during the typhoon.

The enlisted men's mess hall, though damaged\*, functioned normally after the typhoon, and this was a great help in keeping up the morale. Another great morale builder was the squadron day room.

Reconstruction and clean-up have been the major objectives following the typhoon. The area was rewired solely by squadron personnel. Demolished barracks were cleared away and salvaged, and others are being built in their place. A new latrine had to be moved in in place of one that had been blown away. The fallen trees were removed, and those which were still standing were either felled or topped so as to remove future threats to the buildings in the area.

The squadron day room has been enlarged. An adjacent barracks has been annexed and converted into a game room and a reading room.

The First-three Graders' Committee held three meetings during September. The influx of new personnel made it necessary to hold new elections. Members of the present committee are 1st Sgt Roy E. Hauser, 1st Sgt David H. Hayes, T Sgt Allen L. Willey (President), S Sgt Alfred T. Anderson, and S Sgt Gilbert D. Dunning.

Major Richard E. House, Commanding Officer of the 42nd Bombardment Squadron (VH), was graduated from the United States Military Academy at West Point, in May of 1942, and commissioned a second lieutenant in the Cavalry. He won his wings at Roswell, New Mexico in November of 1942, and transferred to the Air Corps in February 1943.

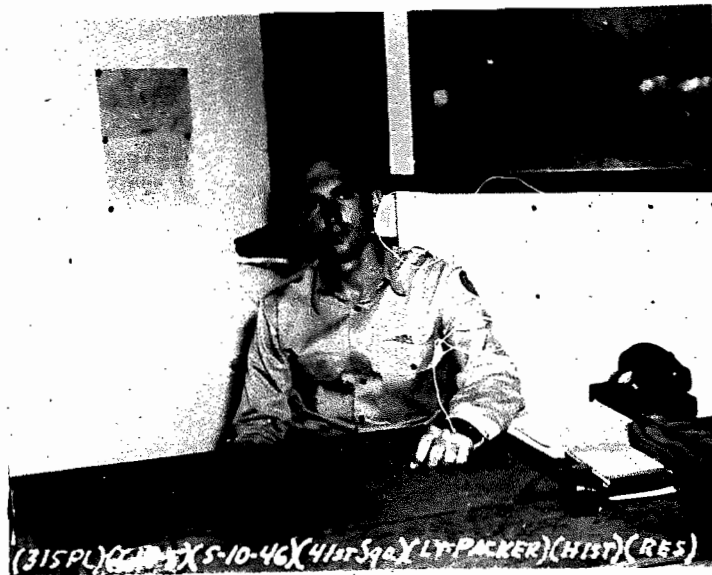
In January of 1943, he was promoted to a first lieutenant. He attained his captaincy in January 1944, and his majority in May 1945.

Major House (then Captain) joined the 331st Bombardment Group (VH),

August 1944. This group trained at McCook, Nebraska and at Vernam Field, Jamaica. Major House came overseas with this group, 1 July 1945, to Northwest Field on Guam. His duty assignment with the 331st was Assistant Group Operations Officer. His group received two battle stars (Air Offensive Japan, and Eastern Mandates Campaign) and was awarded a citation streamer for distinguished action. Major House received the Air Medal with a cluster.

In October 1945, Major House was reassigned to Hq, 315th Bombardment Wing (VH) as Assistant A-3. In January 1946, the Major returned to the 331st Bomb Group as Deputy Group Commander. In March 1946, after the inactivation of the 331st, Major House was assigned as Commanding Officer of the 21st Bomb Squadron (VH), 501st Bomb Group (VH), which assignment he held until April at which time the 21st Bomb Squadron was reduced to a one and one status because of a shortage of personnel, and Major House became Commanding Officer of the 41st Bomb Squadron which was inactivated in May. At that time Major House assumed his present duties.

He was married to Pauline R. Summey at Fremont, Ohio, May 1942. Mrs. House and their two sons arrived at Guam, June 1946, aboard the President Buchanan with the first group of Army dependents.



1st Lt Donald B. Packer, Squadron Adjutant, hails from Fresno, California. Before entering the Army he attended San Jose State Teachers College at San Jose, California. Lt. Packer enlisted in the Enlisted Reserve Corps and was called to active duty 2 February 1943. He entered aviation cadet training in August of the same year and graduated from pilot training June 1944 as a second lieutenant. Before going into the B-29 program he was a B. T. instructor and a B-24 first pilot. Lt. Packer joined the 502nd Bomb Group (VH) at Grand Island, Nebraska, February 1945, and trained there and at Borinquen Field,

Puerto Rico. He came overseas 28 July 1945 with the 502nd Bomb Group to Northwest Field, Guam. In March 1946, he became adjutant of the 41st Bomb Squadron (VH), 501st Bomb Group (VH) which assignment he held until the 41st Bomb Squadron inactivated in May at which time he assumed his present duties. Lt. Packer was promoted to first lieutenant in April of 1946.

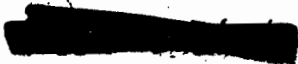

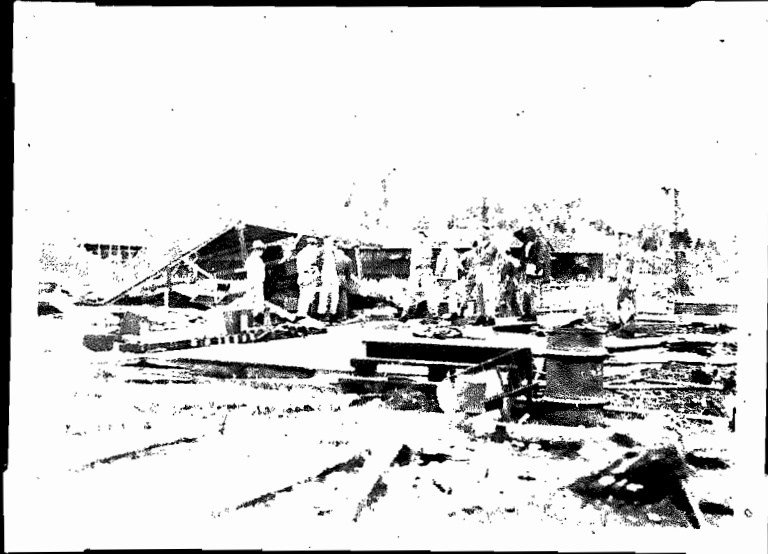

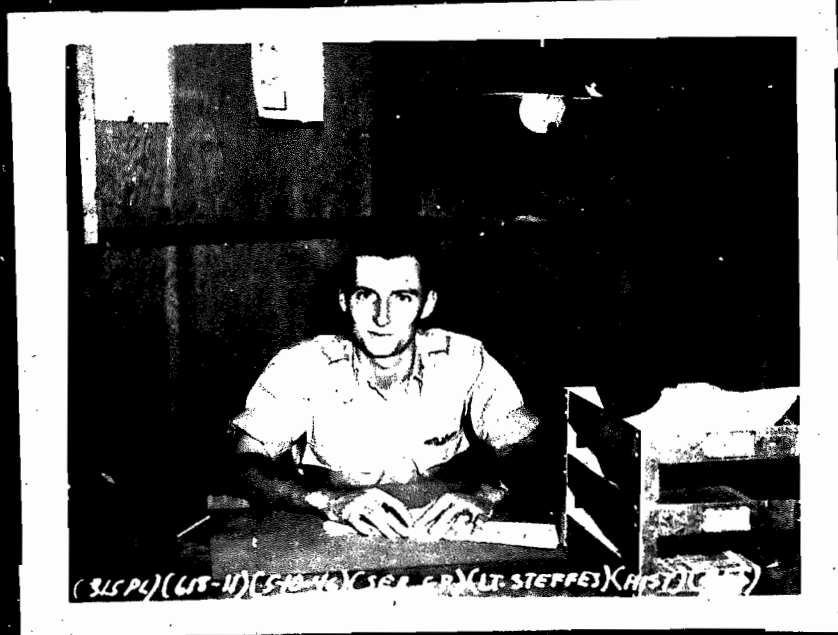
*Typhoon damage, 1st barracks - 12/4/07*

**NARRATIVE**

During the month of October, the squadron was engaged in two major projects, and the passing of the month found these two projects proceeding according to plan.

The first project was the reconstruction of the squadron buildings and policing of the area after the typhoon which struck late in September. Squadron carpenters repaired the Enlisted Men's Mess Hall, rewired the Officers' area and the Squadron area for power and built urinals for both areas. In addition, considerable work was done on the Orderly Room, including moving the building back to its pre-typhoon position, repairing the structure and remodeling and repainting all offices in the building. The Squadron Day Room was repaired, and a Squadron Supply built adjoining. The reading\*\*and game room\*\*\*adjoining the day room was completed and painted. Tree cutting and hauling progressed throughout the month to the point where very few trees remained in potential danger of falling on barracks.

The second major project in preparation for the proposed reduction of the Group to a "one and one" status\*\*\*\*was the squadron's participation in the preparation under Sunset Project regulations of the Group's organizational aircraft (24 B-29's) for transfer to the Zone of Interior and to North Field, Guam. The squadron maintenance personnel, augmented by air crew personnel who were not holding key positions, were released from all duties to devote all their time toward the preparation of aircraft for transfer.

This policy put a heavy work load upon those remaining administrative and supply personnel, however, business proceeded as usual. By the end of October, four B-29's had been delivered to Oahu and six to North Field. \*

The Squadron adopted a "Good Housekeeping" Policy during the month. Daily inspections of barracks were posted in terms of "Honor" and "Untidiest" barracks. Considerable rivalry was built up through a natural reluctance to win "Untidiest" barracks with it's inevitable "GI Parties". Cleanliness and appearance improved remarkably; the difference between "Honor" and "Untidiest" barracks became slight. Though the policy will continue indefinitely, "GI Parties" have been discontinued except in those particularly flagrant cases of "Untidiest" barracks.

The movement of dependents to the Marianas area has continued. At present, dependents of the following personnel are on Guam: Major House and 1st Lt. Saulter. Enroute to Guam are dependents of Capt. Noyes and Capt. Norton. Dependents awaiting port call and/or final action are those of 2nd Lt. Lang, 1st/Sgt. Hauser, M/Sgt. Mayes, T/Sgt. Grike, T/Sgt. Willey, S/Sgt. Anderson and T/Sgt. Carter. \*\*

During the month several incidents of petty thievery were investigated with the result that guards were posted during the daylight hours. At night, each barracks performed its own security. No further incidents of thievery were noted.

The First Three Graders Committee held four meetings during the month. The last meeting was concerned with preparation and planning for a squadron party to be held early in November, using money from the Unit Fund.

The Day Room continued to do a thriving business, the Council Book showing receipts of \$2776.75 and expenditures of \$2772.82 for the month of October.\* Plans were discussed for the disposal of Unit Fund property in anticipation of the squadron's proposed reduction to "one and one" status in November 1946.

During October the squadron was saddened by the death of one of its very popular members, Pvt. Lawrence S. Hyatt of Dumas, Texas, who died during an operation at the 119th Station Hospital on 19 October 1946, at approximately 2000 hours. A letter of condolence was written to his mother, Mrs. Clara Hurst by Major House in behalf of, and expressing the sympathy of the entire squadron. Catholic funeral services were held in the Bombardment Group Chapel on the morning of 25 October 1946. Lt. Thompson, John A. was appointed Summary Courts Officer.\*\*

Promotions and reclassifications proceedings were frozen late in October pending the reduction to "one and one" status of the 11th Bombardment Group and its assigned squadrons. During the month promotions were submitted on Capt. Moyes, 1st Lt. Cosola, 1st Lt. Wade, 1st Lt. E. V. Smith, 1st Lt. Saulter, 1st Lt. Waddell and 2nd Lt. Whisenhunt. Final action has not been returned to this organization. During October, the following Enlisted Men were promoted to the first three grades: Sgt. Weeden, Sgt. Vawter, Sgt. Conner and Sgt. Wilshire, all to the grade of Staff Sergeant (Temp.). \*\*\*

1st/Sgt. Roy E. Hauser enlisted in the Army at the age of 15. His home town is Winston Salem, North Carolina, where he attended Salem High School, enlisting in the Army shortly thereafter, 12 July 1929. He was born in Springfield, Illinois.

His military career of 18½ years has been spent mostly in the Infantry, his Air Corps service being less than one year. He was assigned to the 33rd Infantry in Panama as a permanent Corporal in November 1929, serving with this regiment on detached service to a remount school for two and one half years.

He returned to the United States and was assigned to the 2nd Battalion of the 8th Infantry, then under the command of Col. George C. Marshall, headquarters at Ft. Moultrie, S.C., during which time he was promoted to permanent Sergeant in 1933. One and a half years later, he was assigned to the 27th Infantry in Hawaii, where he served for two and one half years as Supply Sergeant. Returning to the States, he was assigned to the 29th Infantry and assigned for two years to the Infantry school as instructor at Ft. Benning, Ga. In 1937 he was made Acting 1st/Sgt. and in 1938 he was made permanent Staff Sergeant. Following his tour as instructor at the Infantry School, 1st/Sgt. Hauser put in three hitches with the 8th Infantry at Ft. Scrivens, Ga., during which time he was assigned as 1st Cook, Mess Sergeant, Supply Sergeant and 1st/Sgt. For eleven months of the three hitches at Ft. Scrivens he was attached to a medical battalion as 1st/Sgt. through twenty-one phases of medical corps training. In 1940 he was made permanent 1st/Sgt. During his present enlistment (November 1945) he was assigned to the Pentagon, Records and Archives Section, prior to his present assignment overseas to the 42nd Bombardment Squadron as 1st/Sgt. At present, his warrant as 1st/Sgt. dates back as second oldest active 1st/Sgt. in the Army. His experience has done much to improve the military discipline and efficiency of the 42nd Bombardment Squadron.

1st/Sgt. Hauser and Miss Ruth Elizabeth McKee were married in Columbus, Miss., 27 February 1942. Mrs. Hauser is expected to join him here on Guam in the near future.



Master Sergeant David M. Mayes was born at Fayetteville, Arkansas, 23 May 1910. He attended Fayetteville High School, graduating in 1929. He completed one year Pre-law at the University of Arkansas in 1933. M/Sgt. Mayes enlisted in the Army in 1936 for three years in the Field Artillery, Horse Drawn, at Ft. Riley, Kansas. In 1939 he re-enlisted in the Air Corps, specializing in maintenance. He completed service schools for Airplane

Mechanic 747 and was subsequently awarded the SSN 750 (Crew and Line Chief).

M/Sgt. Mayes, in typical Air Corps style, began his tour of bases, hitting March Field, New Orleans, Murco, Calif., Boston (MIT). He served during the war at Key West and Langley Field with the 3rd Sea Search Attack Squadron on Sub Patrol and was awarded a battle star to the American Theater Ribbon, following which he served in Italy, gaining a battle star to the European Theater Ribbon.

During M/Sgt. Mayes' Air Corps service, he has had considerable experience in maintenance, having worked on such types as B-18, B-17, LB30, B-24 and now B-29 aircraft. His experience led him to be assigned during that time as Hanger Chief, Flight Line Chief and Inspection and Maintenance Chief. At present, he is assigned as Crew Chief to obtain the "know how" on B-29's.

In addition to his active service, M/Sgt. Mayes served five years in the Arkansas National Guard.

M/Sgt. Mayes has applied for travel of his dependents to Guam, and expects in the near future to be joined by his wife, Margerite Cecile, and his two daughters, Kathleen and Maureen, aged three and one years respectively.

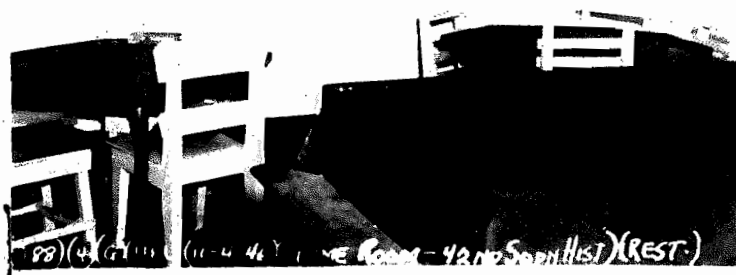

NARRATIVE

of great importance during the month of August was the flying of altitude missions in conjunction with Operations Crossroads. Hence the group as a whole participated in the flights, the 42nd Bombardment Squadron furnished many of the crew members. In like manner did the squadron participate in the "Display of Strength" mission over the principle cities of Japan on Air Force Day, 4 August 1946.<sup>1</sup> This mission was staged out of Okinawa. All of the seven aircraft which were sent out, participated in the mission and returned safely. One practice bombing mission to Guguan in the Marianas was flown by the squadron as well as numerous training and transition flights.

Processing of T/O A & B vehicles proceeded rapidly during the latter part of August when preliminary arrangements for loading vehicles aboard Okinawa bound shipping were made. This was the first real evidence the squadron has had of its anticipated move to Japan. The squadron is presently using vehicles of inactivated units of this field.

The squadron lost through current readjustment policies its remaining Category V officers during August as well as enlisted men who had from twenty-four months service as of 31 August 1946 to twenty-one months service as of 30 September 1946. Incoming personnel were limited to two officers

and four enlisted men. In spite of its greatly reduced strength, the squadron has maintained its normal functions with some degree of efficiency.

Dependents are beginning to arrive on Guam. Men from the squadron are being detailed to work on dependent housing. At present only one family has arrived, that of the squadron commander, but many more are expected soon.

In line with the program to improve the squadron area, the orderly room was painted, logs were cut and laid as bases for coral walks, trees which were potential typhoon threats were felled, and mirrors were provided for the showerrooms. A circular saw, planer, and jig saw were added to the squadron Hobby Shop. The squadron bay room, named "Sea-cockers' Retreat" in a recent contest, is receiving a coat of white paint. Interior improvements to the Bay Room include two large electric fans, a radio, and an ice cream machine which dispenses free ice cream. Two highly successful parties were held in the Bay Room in August. Food and refreshments were provided from the squadron fund.

The First-three Graders Committee has been active this month. Three meetings were held at which squadron problems were discussed. Members of the newly elected committee are 1 Sgt Robert J. Mori, 2 Sgt James H. Chester, 3 Sgt Herbert G. Robertson, 4 Sgt Kenneth H. Keddy, and 5 Sgt Salvatore P. Corisano.

Four enlisted men from the squadron, Flight Sergeant Robert J. Mori, Cpl James W. Brown, Pfc Donald A. Gual, and Pfc James H. Wright were members of the baseball team which won the championship of the warzone. These men departed for Tokyo, 21 August 1946, to participate in the Olympic trials.<sup>1</sup>

There has been no change in the squadron staff: Major Richard A. House, Commanding Officer, 1st Lt Donald H. Tacker, Adjutant, and 1st Lt William E. Sullivan, Operations Officer.

twenty-four B-29 aircraft assigned to the group and which the 42nd Sq shared with one other active squadron have all been transferred: Thirteen to Oahu under Project RCS 523 and one to North Field, Guam.

NARRATIVE

During the first part of the month of November the squadron's priority project\* was the completion of ROS 523 or Milestone Project ("Sunset") under which all organizational B-29 aircraft were either returned to the Zone of the Interior or transferred to North Field, Guam. The squadron's part of the project was completed 13 November 1946 when the last B-29 left Guam for Oahu. During November thirteen B-29 aircraft were ferried to Oahu and one was transferred to North Field, Guam. No losses were incurred. Some of the key maintenance personnel who had worked on this project were allowed to travel as passengers (two per aircraft) from Guam to Oahu. The crews remained in Oahu approximately one week and returned by Troop Carrier aircraft. The squadron personnel strength was reduced considerably during this period, for sometimes six crews would be on TDY at one time.

Guam received another shipload of Army dependents in November, but there was only one dependent aboard for anyone of the 42nd Sq--the wife of Captain L. G. Noyes.

Several promotions submitted last month have been returned approved. Newly promoted officers are Capt E. P. Waddell,\*\* Capt A. B. Cosola, Capt R. W. Saulter, Capt E. V. Smith, Capt F. J. Wade, 1st Lt D. H. Agler, 1st Lt E. W. Edmonds, and 1st Lt J. D. Wisenhunt.\*\*\*

On 15 November 1946, the squadron participated in the world wide muster of the Army. The manual roster report made up for the muster conformed to

the strength of the morning report, and all officers and enlisted men present for duty and on TDY were accounted for.

A rating board made up of 75th Air Service Group officers convened during November in order to determine the status of enlisted men in the 42nd Squadron who had AGCT scores of less than seventy or who had habits or traits of character which rendered retention in the service undesirable. There were six such men from the 42nd Sq who met the board. The section heads, first sergeants, and commanding officers of the men concerned appeared at the board meeting so that accurate findings might be reached. The 42nd Sq C.O., Major Richard A. House, the Squadron Adjutant, 2d Lt John A. Thompson, and Capt Donald E. Taylor, medical member, were on a similar board to make findings and recommendations for twenty-one low AGCT cases from the 75th Air Service Group.\*

The squadron's project during the last part of November was three-fold: 1. Completion of supply and property turnover, 2. Policing of buildings and grounds for vacating, and 3. Administrative close-out including the transfer of personnel.\*\* The bulk of the squadron personnel were reassigned to Hq, 19th Bomb Group at North Field, Guam and to Hq, 20th Fighter Wing at Northwest Field, Guam with a few going to Hq, 20th Air Force and to various other organizations.\*\*\* Under 1st Sgt R. E. Hauser's able supervision,\*\*\*\* the squadron records were screened and boxed for storage.

Lt Thompson, Custodian of the Unit Fund, 42nd Bomb Sq, made the final closing of the unit fund. November had been a busy month with \$1657.27

income and \$1657.27 expenditures. All property remaining was sold to the Unit Fund, 811th Eng Av Battalion for the exact amount of the outstanding liabilities.

T.O. & E. equipment of the 42nd Bomb Sq has already been shipped from Guam and is now stored at Hawaiian Air Materiel Area (Prov) at Hickam Field, Oahu.

The 42nd Bomb Sq and other associated units were released from attachment to Northwest Field Air Base Command (Provisional), 1 November 1946, in preparation of the reduction in strength.\* On 25 November 1946, the last man left the squadron, and the 42nd Sq became a records detachment.

Captain Eugene Q. Steffes, 11th Bombardment Group (VH) Operations Officer is a native of Gary, Indiana. He attended the University of Notre Dame at South Bend, Indiana for two years prior to admittance to the United States Military Academy. He graduated June 1944 and was commissioned a Second Lieutenant in the Air Corps. After graduation, Captain Steffes went through B-17 transition and then served as an instructor pilot in B-17's for six months before going through B-29 transition. He later flew as test crew at Salina, Kansas, and was a member of Project Wonderful before he came to the Pacific Theater in February, 1946 where he joined the 315th Bombardment Wing (VH) on Guam as Corps of Engineers Supply Officer. In May of 1946, Captain Steffes became Commanding Officer of the 581st Air Materiel Squadron (one of the service squadrons associated with the 11th Bombardment Group). In August 1946, Captain Steffes was assigned as

Adjutant of the same squadron, and in September he joined the 42nd Bombardment Squadron (VH) as Squadron Operations Officer, which assignment he held until October 1946, when he became Group Operations Officer.

Captain Steffes was promoted to first lieutenant in March, 1945, and to Captain in September, 1946. He is unmarried and is a member of the Elks Club.



Technical Sergeant Robert G. Grike, RA6571371, was born in Milwaukee, Wisconsin, January 1914. He attended high school in Seattle and graduated in 1931. Before enlisting in the Army he played football for the Ranier Brewery at Seattle for two years. His enlistment, February 1937, was for two years in Ordnance and was served at Schofield Barracks, Oahu, T.H. This enlistment was extended to thirty-four months so that he could play football for the staff regiment at his station. He attained a rating of 1st Class Specialist during this enlistment.

After returning to the U.S. he enlisted in the Air Corps, December 1940, and was sent to Hamilton Field, California where he served as crew chief on B-10's. While at Hamilton Field, he was sent to Chanute



Field, Illinois on TDY to attend welding school. From Hamilton Field, Sergeant Grike, then Corporal, was shipped to the east coast with the 20th Fighter Group and was scheduled to go overseas, but his orders were changed and he was assigned as crew chief on A-20's at Charlotte, N.C. In January, 1943, Sergeant Grike was transferred to Sarasota, Florida, where he served successively as crew chief on P-40's, B-34's and P-51's and later as hanger chief. In October 1945, he reenlisted for three years and was transferred to Bolling Field, Washington, D.C. and put on detached service to the Salt Lake City Airport where his duty was aerial engineer on Major General Shedd's C-47 which duty he held until he came overseas to Guam, August 1946, where he was assigned to the 42nd Bombardment Squadron as crew chief on B-29's.

Sergeant Grike was promoted to Corporal in July 1941. On August 15, 1942, he was promoted to sergeant and later the same day to staff sergeant. Sergeant Grike was made technical sergeant in June 1943.

In June 1941, Sergeant Grike married Mary Elizabeth Brown at Sarasota, Florida. They have one child, Shirley, age four years. Mrs. Grike and daughter are expected to arrive on Guam during the next few months.



Technical Sergeant Arthur J. Carter, RA16040636, Mess Sergeant in charge of the 11th Bombardment Group Officers' Mess is another of the prominent first three graders of the 42nd Bombardment Squadron.

Sergeant Carter was born in Bowen, Illinois in 1907. He attended high school at Center, Missouri and graduated in 1927. In the interim between 1927 and 1940 he held several jobs. He spent eight years with the International Shoe Company at Hannibal, Missouri; two years as a bank clerk; two years as a buying station manager for Swift & Co.; and one year as an automobile factory worker. Sgt. Carter is also an experienced farmer. Prior to his entry into the service he was operating a 450 acre farm in Missouri in partnership with his father.

Sgt. Carter enlisted in the Regular Army in October, 1940, in the Air Corps and began his army career at Scott Field, Illinois.

Although his original intention was to be an AM, he was assigned to duty as a cook which assignment he held until 1941 at which time he became a mess sergeant. In June of 1942 he was transferred to Madison, Wisconsin where he helped open up Truax Field. There he trained cooks and worked as a mess sergeant, feeding 4200 men per mess hall, until October 1945 at which time he reenlisted for three years. While at Truax Field, he received two promotions: S/Sgt. in July 1943 and T/Sgt. in April 1943. After his reenlistment furlough he reported to Scott Field where he fed 3800 enlisted men daily and also trained student cooks.

Sergeant Carter came overseas in August 1946 to Guam where he was assigned to the 42nd Bombardment Squadron.

The Sergeant married Margaret S. Mosby, December 1942, at Hannibal, Missouri. They have one child, Arthur Neal, age five months. Mrs. Carter and son are expected to join Sgt. Carter on Guam sometime next spring.

Sergeant Carter is a master Mason and a member of the Odd Fellows Lodge.

1. This Headquarters is in receipt of a directive to reduce the 11th Bomb Group and the 75th Service Group to a records detachment. (Reference inclosure #1)

2. It is anticipated that in preparing the twenty-two (22) aircraft for flight to Oahu many engine changes will be required.

3. At present the plan is to have all aircraft land at Kwajalein and proceed to Oahu. This plan will not require installation of bomb bay tanks. However, this Headquarters may be required to install bomb bay tanks in order to prepare them for the flight from Oahu to the Zone of the Interior. On the other hand Seventh Air Force may be required to install auxiliary fuel tanks in these aircraft. If such is the case, Guam Air Materiel Area (Prov) and this Air Force may be required to ship bomb bay tanks to Hawaiian Air Materiel Area (Prov), inasmuch as Hawaiian Air Materiel Area (Prov) probably does not have sufficient stocks of tanks to accomplish this mission.

4. For planning purposes, it is desired that this Headquarters be advised of: (a) The number of modified, uninstalled, serviceable R-3350-23A engines on hand in your stocks. (b) The number of serviceable B-29 bomb bay tanks, complete with fittings, on hand in your stocks.

5. The twenty-two (22) aircraft which are dispatched will come partly from the 11th Bomb Group and partly from the 19th Bomb Group. In order to expedite the flow of supplies for this project from your depot to each of these two groups, request authority for a liaison officer from both groups to work with your Supply personnel at Guam Air Materiel Area (Prov).

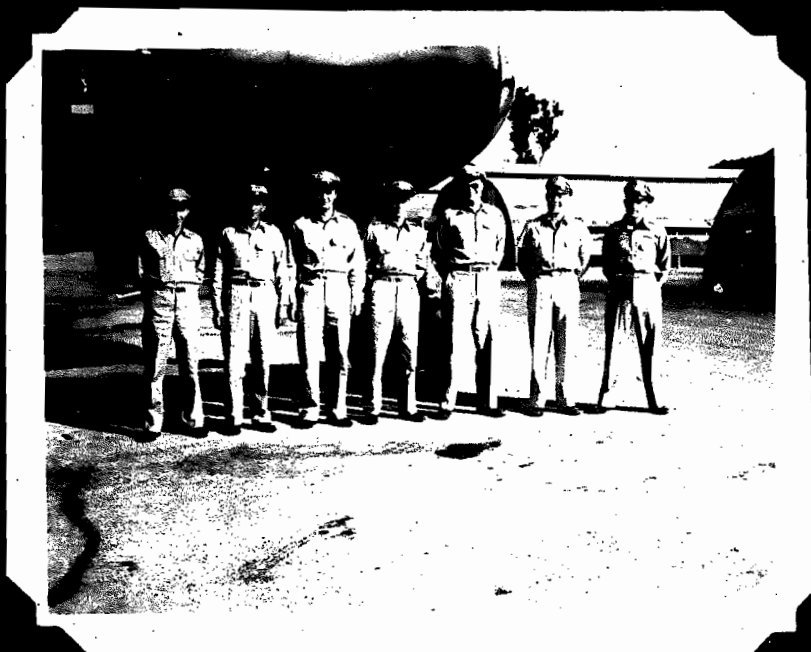
