 represented one helluva weekend, and at the end of it, 15,000 people went home with their own personal memories of it, and with personal highlights which they will tallk of for meny a day to come. This is my own account.

I will remember it for many things; for the friends I knew and net for the first time, and the ones I was newly introduced to for tasting "Bourbon" and "Bagels" for the very first time;for being able to sit in DeForest Kelley's room and talk to him, and for standing at a window on the 49 th floor with George Takei saying to me; "Look, Jenny! New York!" It was an exciting adventure, and there is not one moment of it I would have missed.

This newsletter is the story of our visit to the convention, and through it, I hope you can share in the sights,sounds and atmosphere.

FROLI DAY TU DAY.
FRIDAY: liargaret, Terry and I arrived in Hew York 4pm local time, after an excellent flight, wade shorter by a very funny STERB newsletter.A hairraising taxi drive took us to our hotelg.just one block away from the Americana and the convention.

At 7pm, spurred on by a hastily scrawled telephone miximessage from Floss Del Vecchio, we decided to go look for her room in the Americana. The vast hotel was overflowing with people! Everyone secmed to be queing for something...except us. Well, you know the old saying, ad dogs and Englishmen. Despite the wamings from the hotel staff that there was no such room number, we trundled up to the sixth floor, took a wild, mad guess...and presto! But it was only a rumour.Leonard did not appear, al though the rumour persisted.

I had two most immeadiate aims; to buy as much as could for STAG, and to spread the word about the 1st British ittar Trek Convention. 1000 leaflets were distributed, thanks to STWelcomittee and Space Time Continuum, and over $£ 50$ worth of naterial was purchased from the overcrowded but heavenly dealers roori...a Ilrekkies paradise. If you didn't wind being trod on, lifted off your feet,fried in excessive temperatures and sencrally Iiauled,it was wurth every moment in that crazy place!from tine to time we werc also rewarded by the appearences of George Takei, lichelle liichols or Walter Koenig, who all eiuerged occasionally to sign auto ${ }^{\text {raphs.lichelle's new record was being well promoted, and there were }}$ some lovely posters from George's political owimpign. I wanted to, but never fot as far as the art and fanzine exhibition.

We had brought several gifls with us for various guest stars, which we were anxious to give theli in person. Finally, after pesterine them all norning, the hotel staff took a note to pass on to Deforest $\mathbb{K} e l l e y$. Our patience was at last rewarded! 4pm saw us sittine in his roomofor
me,it was a dreari come true. If nothing else happened, the trip would have been worth it for that $\frac{1}{2}$ an hour alone.

That night, after an exhausting day...woll,how often does one listen to speeches by DC Fontana and De Eelley, sit on De Lelley's bed, buy £50 worth of S'f stuff, watch 'frouble with Itribbles and the Bloopers all in one day?...We were invited to a party. How, some party! Suriday had well and truly dawned before we climbed into our cosy beds. SUMDAY. And what more could happen? riy cup was already running over, but I still hadn't sem everyone I wanted to. It was while we were waiting for Geores liakei to come on stage that Sarah Paul sugested I go into the question line and ask George wyself when we could wect. So that's how I care to be in a lone, snaking queue whilst leorge delivered a rousing political speech concerning the impeachment of dixon. hazain'! As Question time came round and I drew nearur to the stage, I begon to realise what I'd let myself infor. There riust have been $2 \frac{1}{2}$ thousand people in that ballrooli, and little ol' me...'loo late!'lhe wicrophone was jabbed in front of ne. George beaned, and told we to make arrancerents with the cowittee. Afterwards, I spent 30 minutes with hin and discovered a wariogenerous man whoir I gil honoured to count as a friend.

The costure ball! Sittine on a hard floor for three hours isn't easy, but boy, was it worth itt the Forta I could've taken home and cuddled, the Sehlat was almost a rival for pooh Dog, and the transporter ralfunction, breathing smoke, was a sight to behold. The costumes were highly inaginative, anct I was pleased there were not too many kirks and Spocks. Youpay. The last day: It should have beon sad, but somehow it wasn' $t$, and was the clinax to a marvellous weckend. We all trooped into the ballroom to get good seats for the panel discussion. It was late starting, and finally a comittee member came onto the stage. Leonard hinoy was in lew York! Leonard inimoy could be coliing to the comvention... and finally, 10 minutes later... Leonard lininoy was in the Americana!

The penel discussion grot underway, the audience rising to it's feet when Valter Loenig, who looked very tired, tipped back his chair and fell off. I enjoyed the panel, and folt it could have bone on for ruch longer, but then, I'il not a fimoy-type person, and the others were becoming restless.

When Leonard appeared on the stagc, he received the longost and loudest standing ovation of the entirc convention. the audience were excellent.foone attempted to rush forward, to crowd him or to spoil things for others. iveryone in every part of that vast ballroom were on their feetgiving the vulcan Feace sign, and roarinis approval. And even those who had eyes only for Leonard Nimoy could/forive missed the iuarvellous and completely spontaneous tableux that was being enacted on the stace. Fror after he had ereeted each one of the panel, they stood together in a group, their own happinness evident, lookine out across that nass of people who, by their skill and dedication, they had joined together in friendship.

Deforest felley. 4p. .i., 16th February 1974, and five people hovering in front of room number 4936 on the 49 th floor of the Nuericana Hotel. We had becn invited by Deforest felley to meet him in his roumoThis was the witching hour.

When the door finally opened, six press-men filed out. Inen suddenly, there I was, face to face with the han I' d only ever drealed of weeting. Deforest kelley: He looked tired, but bave us all a welcomins swile and invited us into his roon. A press photographer insisted on his photograph, and veliorest called to Floss and I; "Come on girls!" iso we had our photos taken with him, although we never did find the name of the newspaper.
the next invitation was a friendly one to make ourselves coifortable. His rooil was no different to ony of the other double roons.. (irs kelley was with him, bu't we dicin't see her.)... and three chairs into six peuple didn't go, so we perched onto his bed. (Fell, I suppose it could've been (iarolyn's!) When we'dx finished making a good job of eetting his roon to look untidy, FIoss asked if she could sinoke. De said "Sure, I'll join you'" so in the end we all lit up, De included. ("Yent" if you're interested.)

I first explained why we were there, and told hin about our convention in Fngland. Fie was genuinely interested both in that, and the Star trek hovewent in bagland and lemany. ohe subsequently mentioned it three tiues on stage... Iie told us he would be willinéschedule allowing, to attend the 1st British Star frek Convention, but as we had already euessed, he made the condition that his wife must cone too. Realising that we cuuldn't afford an extra airfare of \& 200 or so, irloss asked hiw if he could send a taped ressage, and he said sure he courld do thatsand $\xi$ ave we his-adinesf, for we to comunicite. (Sorry, the first person to ask for it will be phaserud!)

Buisness over, we got to 女xakixe talking of other tnings. Derorest kelley is such a relaxed,friendly iim that this was cortainly no effort.floss explained to him that she was ry "interpretur", and De laughed and said jokingly; "I haven't heard zor understood a word she's said yet. We touched on subjects as widely varied as the fuel-crisis, De's Liovies... he says he's quite used to being the bad :uy now...and "waria Einglish beer" which he's keen to sample, never having been to tineland before.

At his suggestion, we were able to get autographs, and to take his photofraph...I had wine taken with his arril around ne.How can I ever wash that spot again? rloss asked him to say "Cheese," and he laughed. "I'll dio nothine of the kind:" he told her, but eave a lovely grin.

Before we left, I fave him the many presents you had sent to hin, and he could barely believe his eyes. "You carried all these fron Eneland?" he asked, and I explained that he had many friends in fieland and werlany who wished hin well. Fie thanked us all, and asked ae to convey his appreciation to everyone in Eneland. He was really genuinely surprisud and.pleased with them.

Deirorest kelley is a wunderful wangrelaxed, warn and very friendly. When he speaks to you, he looks at you directly wi th those incredibly blue eyes(which are even better behind his specs) and whon he smiles,it. is vecause of eenuine pleasure. So warry "Stars" are disapointing in real life, but not Deforest kelley. He is certainly one of the most pleasent inen I have ever wet. I an deeply sorry that we cannut afford the extra airfare for

George Takei.
Backstage in the ballroom, I waited for George Takei's speech to end.: a little nervously, I rust admit. Well, after being glared at by the con committee, and being told; "You can talk to him MEERE:" (Indicating a narru ow, draughty corridorg) woulan't you be?

George's exit from the stage was heralded by a deafening roar of approval as he gave the audience the Vulcan Peace Sign. He fair bounded down the steps, very slim and agile, and dressed in a lovely brown leather suit. He gave me a huge grin.
"Hi!" he greeted me, and immeadiately invited ine up the comittee room with hin. Ever tried ascending 49 floors of a hotel via back-alley stairs, through kitchens, and up double fast lifts? George looked as fresh巴s a daisy after this rilarathon, but I was puffed. Oh the shame of it: He's four years older than me!

Before we sat dow, George took me to the window, which, not surprisingly at 49 floors up, afforded a magnificent view across New York towards Central Park. Pafting his arm round me,he pointed into the distance. "Lookg Jenny! Vew York! There's the Hudson River...and over there, many miles away,is Californiac"

We sat down on the settee, and I was just about to get down to business when a member of the comittee came in. George greeted her with a huge kiss, then turned round and grinned at me. "Sorry Jenny!" carue the remark.. "ifust. recharge the batteries every few hours."
By now, I was word perfect on explaining about our convention. George's grin was becoming wider, and when $I$ asked hin if he would be willing to come over,he was genuinely delighted, especially when I explained that the profits would be going to the World Wild Life Fund, and the "Two Will Do" ${ }^{11} P A$ education scheme. His answer, of course, was "Yes:" He is really looking forward to the event, and we talked for several minutes about this and the star Trek concepts, which he firmly believes in. In short, George Takei is the most disarming; affectionate man in all the nicest possible ways, and $I$ know we will be as celighted to welcome t凶x him to fingland as he was in his acceptance.

James Doohan.

George bogan his speech by saying how touched he was to see so many: sharing in Star Trek, and the possibility of revival. Star Trek, he said, was a show with a freat deal of substonce, ond will continue to be so. It exhibited the fact of being able to overcule the things of the twentineth contury, and of races working together.

IIe continued; "Unless we work towarus the reality of star. Trelk it will all be a web of lies, for Star Trek deals with the things that are attainable。 Nichelle Hichols.

Niicholle told the aucience that she had never been given to joinine cults and oreanisationsgas they aie usually bogged down in dogwa; but she added that there was no dogma in star irek, but a cohesive law about sonething very importent. Inuividuality is important to any movenent, she contirucd, and in order to change, we wust understand what we aro changine. Questions to Niquclic;

A. A movie called "Thick Turner," and a wini-albun called "Dark Side of the Hoon."
Q. Yould Uhana be afraid..and show it?
A. Yes, under crisis, but she would be strong enough to stand up to thet crisis. When liy son was 18 wonths old he drank cleaning fluid, and I had to asisst at the stowach washout. It was only aftcrwards when I knew he'd be alright that I fainted. Yes, thura would be afraid, but sho trusts hirk enough to tell hin of her fear.
Q. Do you think Star irek will coue back?
A. Sincerely, $H B$ would have to be retarded if they lint brinc it back:
Q. Dic you like workine with Bill shatner?
A. Bill Shatner is one of the greatest actors alive. He was good to work with and for.

Fichelle endea; "then the convention is over and we zo our separate ways, don't ever lose the beautiful spirit of faith and hope which you have instillod into me. Pcace and long life."
