

July 2, 1964 Hazlehurst, Jeff Davis Co., Georgia. LEFT LAS
 Cruces, New Mexico, June 25, 1964; arrived College Station
 Texas, June 26, 7:00 PM; spent Sunday in TCWC; LEFT
 Monday morning 9:00 AM for Hazlehurst, arriving here
 July 1, 1964, at 2:30 AM. Have seen some DOR masticophis
 and Elephe on road. Has rained everyday so far, mostly
 afternoon + evenings. Went out at 10:00 PM last night
 (July 2) following evening shower; heard Bufo,
Hyla acularis, Rana pipiens (did not collect any of
 these); + collected Hyla femoralis, Hyla squirella,
Bufo terrestris, Bufo quercicus, + Gastrophryne
carolinensis. All of the latter were seen + collected
 in amplexus, no eggs were seen in the water.

Color notes as follows: (in life)

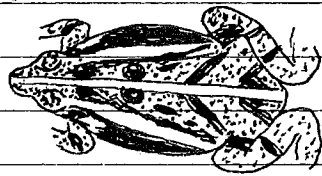
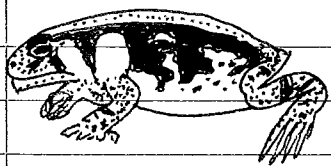
Hyla femoralis ♂ Dorsum / lavender brown with darker
 dorsolateral reticulations of dark brown, forming cross
 on top of head between eyes; rear of femur with
 bright ochraceous yellow spots enclosed by dark brown
 edges; some yellow spots tending to run together;
 anus with light cream bar transverse; dark brown
 bar below; tibia/fibula with dark bar just above
 heels; heels with light tan bar (lighter than g.c.);
 out edge of foot trimmed likewise; venter, fore
 arm + throat area granular; cream to flesh;
 vocal pouch dark brown; lips whitish; white
 pustules conspicuous on chin; thin blackish line from
 eye, over tympanum, terminating on posterior 1/3 of
 body, laterally. light tan line over eye to tym.; darker
 below blackish line than above; tarsus area with

cream or light tan spots surrounded by ocreaceous yellow area; otherwise cream colored; anterior femur + groin likewise; groin without spots however; Iris similar to dorsal color. Tibio-Fibula ventro-lateral area ochre-yellow.

Hyla squirella ♂ - dorsum variable, in daylight bright chartreuse green; to lime; some more yellowish + tan. Night calling colors red-orange + tan. no dorsal spots or reticulations; cream-yellow line forming triangle below eye, below groin; to femur; wavy on sides of body; venter flesh-yellow; limbs also; faint yellowish line across anus; along dorsal-lateral post. margins of tibiofibula; vocal sac yellowish; iris cream with darker flecks; post. femur nr. knee somewhat ochre-yellow.

Bufo gularis - ♂ venter cream-white; small blackish spots just below or on sternum; vocal sac brownish, small; dorsum brownish with black diagonal lines from cream to yellowish mid-dorsal stripe from nostrils to anus. limbs grey barred with black; feet also; dorso-lateral cream-tan line from eye to groin, widening post.; bordered below with black area covering most of sides; above by ground color; iris silver; white patch above arm in shoulder region; ♀ - likewise, belly darker, whitish pustules more conspicuous.



April 14, 1965 - Left Las Cruces 4:00 PM; arrived roadside park; Hwy 180, 38 mi E. EL Paso, Texas, + camped for night.

April 15, 1965 Left campsite 6:00 AM; arrived White's City, Eddy Co, New Mexico; 8:30 AM. Bought bread, smokes, and left for Sitting Bull Falls, Eddy Co, arriving there 10:30 AM. Very cool until 12:00 noon, Lizards out on rocks about 12:30 PM; collected

1 C. exsanguis juvenile in Apple Orchard of The ranch of Mrs. Weber, $\frac{3}{4}$ mile from Falls. Collected 5 S. undulatus, 1 Urosaurus ornatus, and 1 S. painsetti on rocks, 1 Tantilla nigriceps under rock at camp.

April 16, 1965 - drove 2 mi up road (towards Carlsbad) from camp site. - Collected 3 Urosaurus, 3 S. undulatus, and 1 S. painsetti. 8:30 A. 10:00 AM. Major vegetation is Cedar, Lechuzgea, Cholla, + grasses. some willow + cottonwood along canyon bottom. 12:30 - 1:30 PM - same locality; 3 Urosaurus ornata (2♂, 1♀) + 1 ♀ juv. ^{1 E. obsoletus} S. undulatus.

April 17, 1965 Day windy, drove to Weber ranch and collected around old lumber piles; 3 S. undulatus 2 U. ornata, 1 C. exsanguis, 1 E. obsoletus, and 1 E. multivirgatus. Collected 3 Peromyscus at camp site, with small live trap. Brought back to University alive, and skins put up at that time 2♂, and 1♀.

April 18, 1965. returned to Las Cruces, via Artesia + Cloudcroft. Stopped at White Sands + collected two H. maculata, sent to K. Norris U.C.L.A., for color refraction.
