18 May 1998

Bryan, Texas - Boquillas xing, BBNP.

6am rising, ran to McDonald's for burritos, loaded Mary's clothing, and left town at 7:45am for Big Bend Ntl. Park to meet Mike & Jenna Forstner at the Barker Research Station on the Rio Grande River, nr. the Boquillas Crossing.

Drove usual route via Hearne, Rockdale, Georgetown, Hano, Menard, Iraan, Ft. Stockton, then Hwy 885 to Marathon, where we met Rob & Mindy Dean at their house, visited some 40min, & then drove to Barker house, arriving 7:10pm. We drove 590 miles this date, with several stops for Mary to walk.

Mike & Jenna were already here; so we partially unloaded the truck; ate tuna helper for supper, & drove to Rio Grande Village to check Mike's traps (he has 7 out). Found nothing in the 3 traps in the beaver pond; we did find Gullfrogs, Leopard frogs, and Blotched water snakes in the pond, and a Texas toad in the park, a dead Bullbat (Caprimulgidae) at junction of Boquillas Canyon/Rio Grande Village roads. Returned to "Barker" to b/ged snake & frogs; and at house we found \pm 10 H. furcatus on walls; we collected 5 tails for muscle samples. Finally in bed by midnite!

19 May 1998

Barker Res. Sta; BBNP.

7am awake; ate banana; Mike up by 7:30; Mike & I set traps 3/10 mi down river from house, 2 hrs to set 3; had to cut trails; set in hot springs area; ate quickly cereal breakfast, & drove to Rio Grande Village where we set traps in G. gaigeae pond; beaver pond; & in river. Ran Mike's traps (?) from yesterday; caught 19 turtles; 15 I. gaigeae, & 4 A. spinifera. Replaced Mike's traps with minis, (set nine) & returned to house to take blood. (1pm). Finished by 4pm; Mike & I checked for traps below house; 1 Apalone, 2 T. gaigeae,

(19 May (cont.), Drove to Rio Grande village, Mike checked River traps,
G. gaigeae pond netted 3 kinosternon flavescens, + 1 Tachemys
gaigeae; The Beaver pond netted 5 I. gausei, 1 K. flaves.,
+ 1 A. spinifera. Mike came in with 4 I. gausei, +
1 A. spinifera ♀. We rushed these back to house, measured,
weighed + bled the lot. A total of 38 turtles today;
Mike + Jenna packed + left at 7pm. We will catch up
with them on May 27 at Officers Quarters, in
Castolon, BBNP. Mary + I ate hotdog supper + will
run traps + rebait tomorrow. After dark I checked
building and observed 19 H. turcicus + caught 6 for samples.

20 May

Barker House, BBNP →
Up 6am; Breakfast of cereal, off to Panther Junction at
8:30 am; found in Jenna's ck for 60⁰⁰ to Susan Simmens, who
then issued a key to the officers Quarters for Castolon.
Mary Kay Manning not in. Spoke with Raymond Sterler, received
a copy of my Tantilla permit; Then Mary bought cards +
book marks. We returned to RG village to check traps +
rebait. Of 12 traps, caught 5 in two traps in G. gaigeae
pond. Moved three traps to bank in River; 2 in Beaver Pond
to #4 spring pond because I saw T.g. there; We returned
to Barker house at 11:40; sandwich lunch; I potted the
3 T.g., + marked the two K.f. from G. gaigeae pond; meas.
weighed + bled all FIVE. Finished at 2pm. At 4pm, returned
to RG village; had two T.g. in river trap + 1 A.S.; two T.g. in
Beaver pond (1 recpt # 132938485A). I repaired 13th trap, +
placed it in #4 spring pond. 3 Traps in G. gaigeae yielded
two K.f., + 3 T.g. Returned to Barker House, recorded data on
all turtles, bled all; + finished by 7:30pm. I prepared geckos,
+ 1 N. erythrogaster from Beaver pond. 651/231 mn ♂; 4
Hemidactylus turcicus from house.

21 May Barker house; to RG village

6:30 am; cereal breakfast, photo of small T. gaigeae from Beaver pond; showered, drove to RG village to check traps at 10 am. Nothing in Beaver, or #4 Spring (7 traps), re-baited. We saw a ♂ + ♀ Anolis carolinensis in dead mesquite tree at entrance to board walk (right side), tree in water of Beaver pond right in front of 1st trap on right side. Male anole displaying to ♀ anole; tried to catch both but failed because of depth of mud + thorns. Drove to river set of 3 traps; upstream 2 traps (1 empty), had ① A.s. + T.g.; lower trap had ② T.g., but one swam out while I baited, so only caught 1. G. gaigeae 3 traps contained only skin in one trap; a rec T.g., 1 unmarked ♀, + 1 marked K.f. ♂. Bought 2 apples + 6 cokes at store + returned to Barker house.

To do the four further (3 T.g., 1 A.s.). Changed bait buckets, new cans; data taken on turtles, returned to sites at 4 pm, after driving Mary to mouth of Boquillas Canyon (1.6 mi); ran traps in #4 spring, + Beaver Pond; zilch with new bait, Rio Grande Camp ground site only 2 A. spinifera; + G. gaigeae pond, 4 K.f. flavescens. No more T. gaigeae. Pulled all traps, washed + dried, and returned to Barker house to measure + bleed K.f. + A.s..

We will return them tonight + leave in morning for Presidio. Between all of us, we caught total of 62 turtles in 3 days; 36 of these are blood samples of T. gaigeae, + 2 RC; + 1 escaped trap = 39 T. gaigeae.

22 May Up 6:30, on road by 8:30; drove to Presidio, + had lunch at El Patio Rest., bought some food + drove on to Mesquite Ranch, 17 mi, and 11 mi. Presidio, up Hwy 170 + then Ranch road thru Mesquite Ranch to Chisos Mt. Nat. Area.

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22 May (cont) Met Andy at one of 4 buildings on property. We walked some at 2-4pm; and at elev. of 4036 ft., we found Cnemidophorus dorsalis fairly common, along with its presumed parents - C. septentrionalis and C. tigris. TN's people began showing up; about 40 total. We were crowded into small spaces. Did not sleep at night; Mary & I went to bed about 11pm.

23 May Chinati Mt. Ranch Presidio Co., Tx., Andy, David Haines,

24 May Mary: I drove to Cimarron some 6 mi up river (on ranch road) & found tadpoles of Rana berlandieri? Crotalus atrox, & later that evening, Tremorophodon wilkinsoni, Thamnophis cyrtopsis, Crotalus molossus, Crotalus lepidus, Coleonyx brevis, Gastrophryne olivacea; Cophosaurus texanus, Urosaurus ornatus, Sceloporus magister, Sceloporus undulatus, Phrynosoma modestum (DOR); Crotaphytus collaris; Higgs & crew up one canyon arm found Diadophis punctatus, Masticophis taeniatus, & found Salvadora hexalepis (accidentally cut in two pieces with shovel while digging it up); crew also found M. flagellum, C. ornatus, C. exsanguis, Uta stansburiana, Bufo speciosus, Eumeces tetragrammus, & Eumeces obsoletus. Mary & I in sack about 10:30pm.
PS: Did manage to find Turkey Vulture with 2 chicks in pile of rocks about mile from camp, & 2 Javelina in old building with beds near camp.

24 May Chinati Mt. Ranch on Casto/Onyx Ranch.
We had show & tell at 9am; Kathryn & Ted having trouble with electricity in their Chev.; we took off about 9:45 am. Following them to Presidio; Since this was Sunday, no one would help & they took off for Alpine.

24 May (cont.) Mary & I found DOR Pituophis c. affinis in red Ford. We drove on to Lajitas for lunch; then on to Study Butte for some groceries, & arrived Castolon about 2:30pm. Unloaded truck into Officers Quarters (AC/RCP) great!!! We then drove to Cottonwood Camp Ground, Santa Elena River Crossing, and 1 mi N. Cottonwood camp ground; finally put out 6 turtle traps at Cottonwood, & 4 traps 1 mi N; where road reaches River. Finished by 5:pm. Found pink Masticophis flagellum swimming in river, 1mi N.

Cottonwood camp. Returned to house; ate soft tacos for supper, showered; preserved, & wrote notes until 8pm. Ran turtle traps. 8-9pm; the six at Cottonwood yielded 2 gar (Mexico side) + 3 Apatani (1 trap) on American side. The upstream 4 traps yielded 5 turtles in one trap (1 T. gaigeae + 4 Apatani) + and two Apatani in another. For 10 turtles this side, this sets! Will measure & bleed in morning! Too tired tonight!

25 May Castolon, BBNP. 6:30am; Left at 8:30 to drive river road to check areas for trapping turtles. Found a nice one 3.8 mi NW of Castolon, set two traps there. Checked & repaired remaining traps (10), no turtles, but had a gar (long nose). Back at house by 12:15pm. Checked traps at 7:00pm; contained 3 T. gaigeae + 2 A. spinifera. returned to O.Q., & made DNA samples of T.g., & carapace samples of A.s. In sack by 10pm.

26 May Castolon, BBNP. 7:30am, cereal breakfast; made trap run at 10:30am; had 2 T. gaigeae + 3 A. spinifera. Returned to house & collected samples of carapace & blood. Ate lunch, read, & headed back to traps at 7pm.

26 May (Cont.) Traps contained 2 A. spinifera + 1 T. gaigeae. Lost one trap at Cottonwood camp for 45 min; but finally found it. I had hidden it too well! At Castolon site to date; we have found 7 T. gaigeae + 16 Apalone spinifera, 8 ~~♂~~[♀]; T. gaigeae, 4 ♂, 2 ♀.

27 May Castolon, BBNP. Ran traps morning & evening, bled 5 T. gaigeae, & 4 A. spinifera. Mike, Janna, & Steve Holt show up at 3pm. Took them to all 3 trap sites, & they set 11 traps. Ate late supper, & Mike, Janna, & Steve drove roads for traps.

28 May Steve Holt packs & on road by 8am. The Four of Us head SE down west river road to Black dike, where we set 18 traps by 12:00 noon. We roasted the remainder of day until 5:15pm, when looked as if it would rain, we pulled all traps, because we were 10.8 mi. From pavement; & we had two large arroyos to cross & couldn't if it rained. We caught 10 Trachemys gaigeae and 8 Apalone spinifera. We immediately bled the Apalone & released them & carried the T. gaigeae to OQ. Bled the T. gaigeae before supper; & soon after, Mike & Janna drove roads to P.J. We drove road to S.E. overlook & back. Saw one small snake, but it got off road before I could catch it. Mary & I in sack by 11pm; Mike & Janna by midnite.

29 May Castolon, BBNP - Alpine, TX.
Up by 7am, packed truck & on road to Alpine by 9:30am. Arrived Alpine 11:30am; bought 47[♂] groc., & visited Scudday's house. He & Fern in Midland for Doc. appnt. We eat at Outback with Mike & Janna; & visit Scudday's house 68[♂] in; not in; Mike & Janna take off for Lajitas, & we

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29 May (Cont.) do not expect to see them again until 1 August.
Mary & I sit in Fern & Tim's yard until pm; & wait
for them to return from Midland. Mike & Jenna
Found P. c. affinis dor, on mile marker 12 from
Castolon, & we found small DOR C. stans, mi SSW
of Study Butte on 118. We have caught ± 94 Trachemys
gagates since the trip started; & a total of 114 turtles
in all. Preserved herps on tail gate waiting for sandbag
now 4pm; been in Alpine for 4.5 hrs. We will leave
in few minutes for Sanderson. In Sanderson by 6:pm; stay in
Desert Aire Motel; eat at Kountry Kitchen, & in bed by 10pm.

30 May Sanderson - Lost Maples St. Park

Leave Sanderson ± 9:30am; DOR M. f. festaeus ♀ sul 670, tail
263mm; 4.5 mi SE Sanderson (musk tissue); drive on to hybrid
Zone 10.8-12.2 mi SE Sanderson; collect C. inornatus, extremely
dry; observe C. septentrionalis? in C. gularis site at camp
site on hill; perhaps indication that ranges shift in
dry conditions? Drive on to Del Rio, then to Bracketville,
San Felipe Spgs "full of people"; (Sat.), take 334 by to
Camp Wood; then 337 N to its junction with 187 N, & 4 mi
to Lost Maples St. Park; arriving 4:50pm. Park not ready
for us; gave us the last camp site (7); & will let Roy
Hedeman (Suptnt) handle it tomorrow (Sun). Roy is on
duty from 12-8 pm. Unloaded truck & walked to Rio Sabinal,
just a trickle; woman (Martha & John), fell at low water xing,
hurt head, elbow, back & ribs; we took them to their camp
Jon Fisher (53 ac) place just outside entrance to park. Talked
some, & then returned to #7, fixed supper; did crack walk,
only Acris calling. Saw Fish & grey Fish in stream. Bathed
& in sack by 10:30pm.

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31 May 1998 Lost Maples St. Park

Up at 7:00 am; fixed breakfast + coffee; tagged birds +
butterflies; observed brown-headed cowbirds, purple Finch,
scrub jay, Inca doves, ^{Am. Cuckoo,} ^{Fox Squirrel,} titmouse, in host camp. Mary saw hummers.
Haven't decided what to do until John Malone arrives. We
checked out the paved roads (not much) + then found
C. gularis ♀ in road repair (disturbed) area. Drove back
to camp, bled lizard, and waited for John. John + Roy
Heideman show up at 12:30 pm. We talk about sites, +
then check gear bought by Geo. Kassly. Everything but
plastic pails or buckets. Found places for two arrays.
John took off for C.S. to bring back #10 cans, at
2pm. I don't know if he will make it back, he is
very tired. Before he left, Roy Heideman, John + I
(Roy) caught another ♀ C. gularis in Maintenance Shd.
Mary + I loaded up the mining bar, sift fence, staples,
sledge (8lb), stakes, funnel traps; + built a Y
array near headquarters. Took up about 3½ hrs.
Really hot!! We came back + showered; I fixed
tacos for supper; + then we set up two funnels
below shelf rock in flowing water of Sabinal river.
Found tadpoles at 1st crossing of Sabinal at Park
entrance. Collected some for John. In sack by 10pm.

1 June Lost Maples St. Park

6:15 a.m., fixed coffee + wrote notes. Cereal breakfast,
John did not arrive until 8:am; too sleepy to drive back in.
8:45am, John + I finished Array 1, and by 10am, were
installing array 2 in open grass meadow seeded with
Indian grass. Finished that one by 12:56 pm. John had to
go to Kerrville for groceries, left at 1:30; Mary + I moved

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1 June (Cont.) Camp from 7 to #4; more shade! Roy Hideman comes by, 3 times to take us (John too) to view possible new sites. John finally returns 4:40pm; Roy, John, Mary & I go to possible sites 3, 4, 5, + 6. After working the sites, we decided on a riparian site below Maintenance Building.

2 June 1998 Lost Maples St. Park

Up at 6:30; after waiting 1 hr for John to get his act together, we drive with Roy, to trail head of West trail + East trail, and put in Yaray under Maple Forest on slope of wet Can Creek. Finished in 3 hrs. Had lunch with John & then walked east Trail to its uphill run nr. Primitive Camp Site A, + we walked up Hale Hollow Canyon (no trail) until till we reached 3 arroyo entrances close to each other, + then returned to camp + 5 mi walk. We saw lots of tadpoles of R. berlandieri + adult Acris up the creek in most pools. Found a rock that looks like a 5 foot toad; 2 bushouts in solid bedrock we dubbed "two-Tubs"; Found one small spring, + very little water flow in any of the area. Some travertine formations with Maidenhair Fern. Saw minnows that looked like Redhorses hincor, D. sonora. Returned at 5:45pm; out about 4 hours. Ate supper with Karen + Roy Hideman, along with Camp hosts Veda + Jim Dale, + John Malone. In sack by 9:30pm, really tired. We saw C. texanus, U. ornatus, E. brevilineatus, S. lateralis, R. berlandieri + Acris crepitans on walk.

3 June Lost Maples State Park

Up at 6:30am; cool morning, cloudy, Got John M. up at 7:30; we set up Yaray #4 in riparian site just below Maintenance bldg., 2 hours; lots of sweat. Finished at 11am; drove to Yaray #1, + descended can hole pits to

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3 June (cont.) double the depth of can trap. This took 1½ hrs; lots of rock! We ate lunch before we went, so it was 1:30pm when we quit. John M. ran Arrays at 11:30 am, nothing in any of them. John ran to store for bread, but no bread, not until 5pm. We designed some Pitfall arrays in shape of L, also some that had 12 cans per array.

... we settled on ... walked between 3:15-3:35 pm, looking for S. olivaceus, but found zip. Checked the four arrays at 6:30pm; S. lateralis in control bucket of Maples Array. Also saw one in Leaf litter. Found 9 S. olivaceus on rocks, then jumped to Maple tree where I stunned it with rubber band. Back to camp where I fixed spaghetti (John's spaghetti + sauce) mixed veggies, Light Fruit cocktail, + coffee. Said goodbye to John about 8:45pm. Mary called Arley + Sally; he is off to Georgia in morning, so we are heading home tomorrow. Showered, + ready for sack at 10pm. Drew blood on S. olivaceus.

4 June Lost Maples State Park - Bryan/College Station
Up at 6:30 am; cereal breakfast, began loading truck. Finished by 8:15 am; stopped by Park office + said goodbye to Ray + workers. Bought Tennant's 2nd Edition (1988) at Park OFFICE. We drove to Hwy 337, to Hwy 16, to Hwy 46 to I-35, to Hwy 21 to Hwy 47 and home by 2pm. Good trip. Did not go to office to check mail until 8pm. Too much to do and look at with mail + debts at home. Did feed tortoises + turtles. Bought some groc., + ate at home. In sack by 10pm.
