Educated at universities in France (Sciences-Po Lille), Germany (Münster) and the Netherlands (Twente), he earned his PhD in International Relations from the Department of Development Studies of SOAS (School of Oriental and African Studies), University of London. “The 2017/2018 Iranian Revolt: Causes, Comparative Characteristics, and Consequences”

ABSTRACT:

The talk will discuss the revolt that shook Iran at the turn of the year, marking a watershed moment in the Islamic Republic's almost 40-year history. Firstly, it will elaborate on its causes, both socio-economic and political, as reflected in its slogans and demands. Secondly, taking into account the revolt's social base - the "middle-class poor" (Asef Bayat)-, it will provide a comparative analysis to the 2009 Iranian Green Movement and the 2010/11 Arab Uprisings. Finally, it will discuss the revolt's consequences and offer an outlook for future developments.
