Sexual Assault Prevention & Awareness

According to the Texas A&M University Office of Risk, Ethics and Compliance (OREC) 2022 annual report, there were 48 sexual assaults reported on campus in 2021. With most sexual assaults going unreported, it's reasonable to think the actual numbers are far higher than the 48 in OREC's report. The Rape, Abuse & Incest National Network (RAINN) states that only 310 out of 1,000 sexual assault victims notify authorities, so 2 out of 3 assailants get away with their crime. In the face of such disheartening statistics, Benjamin Franklin's advice that "an ounce of prevention is worth a pound of cure" still holds true.

Officially declared in 2001, April is observed as Sexual Assault Prevention & Awareness Month (SAPAM). Every year, Student Life at Texas A&M provides programming to observe SAPAM. This year's programming includes a fashion show, trauma informed yoga, boxing classes, Books That Speak Out hosted by the University Libraries, and an evening to Take Back The Night.
