



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INTRODUCTION



The Bubble

Beijing, China



The Beijing National Aquatics Center, also known as the Water Cube, is an architectural marvel that was built for the 2008 Summer Olympics in Beijing, China. This unique building was designed by PTW Architects and the China State Construction Engineering Corporation with the intention of creating a futuristic, energy-efficient, and visually striking venue for swimming and diving events.

The most striking feature of the Water Cube is its translucent exterior, made up of hundreds of thousands of ETFE panels that create a bubble-like effect. These panels are not only lightweight and durable but also energy-efficient, allowing the building to maintain a stable temperature while reducing energy consumption. The Water Cube's design is both innovative and visually stunning, making it a symbol of Beijing's modernity and innovation.

After the 2008 Olympics, the Water Cube underwent several changes and transformations. In 2009, it was converted into a water park that attracted millions of visitors each year. In 2010, the building underwent a significant renovation to make it more sustainable and energy-efficient. Upgrades included the installation of an LED lighting system and a rainwater harvesting system.

The Water Cube's most recent transformation occurred in 2020 when it was converted into a temporary ice rink for the Beijing 2022 Winter Olympics. Sarajevo, Bosnia



Rio Olympic Park was a grand architectural project that was meant to showcase Brazil's economic and technological prowess to the world. However, just five years after the 2016 Summer Olympics, the complex has fallen into disrepair, leaving a trail of unfulfilled promises and abandoned facilities. The park, designed by Brazilian architect Carlos Porto, was built in the Barra da Tijuca neighborhood and spanned an area of 1.18 million square meters. It included nine venues, such as the Olympic Aquatics Stadium, the Rio Olympic Arena, and the Future Arena.

The park was a marvel of modern engineering and was built at a cost of \$12.6 billion, making it one of the most expensive Olympic projects in history. However, once the Olympics were over, the facilities were left unused, and the park quickly became a symbol of Brazil's economic and political troubles. The lack of maintenance and upkeep led to extensive damage and vandalism, and the once vibrant and modern facilities were now overgrown with weeds, the swimming pools were empty, and the stadiums were stripped of their seats and equipment. The Rio Olympic Park's rapid decline illustrates the negative consequences of building large, expensive sports facilities for short-term events without considering their long-term viability. The facilities were designed for specific sports and were not easily adaptable to other events, making their repurposing challenging. Additionally, the high costs of maintenance and operation were not taken into account during the planning phase, leaving the park in disarray.

The failure of the Rio Olympic Park has had significant economic and social implications for the city and the country as a whole. The abandoned facilities have become a breeding ground for crime and have left a negative impression on tourists and locals alike. The park's decline is also a reminder of the importance of sustainable architecture, where designs take into account the long-term viability of buildings and their impact on the surrounding communities. The Rio Olympic Park was a grand architectural project that failed to live up to its potential due to a lack of foresight and planning. Its decline has left a lasting impact on the city and serves as a cautionary tale for future architectural projects. 







The Divide


15t Turn

The user enters the building in the fist section which is representation of todays eras. The user then makes the first turn which is a representation of the olympic era.




2nd Turn


In the design process of the museum, careful consideration was given to the views from each of the three sections, creating a truly immersive and reflective experience for the visitors.


