PREFACE

Retrospective access to reviews of science fiction books prior to the first volume of SCIENCE FICTION BOOK REVIEW INDEX has been primarily a matter of serendipity and luck. The Editor is pleased to announce to users of SFBRI that this is no longer the case. Gale Research Company of Detroit, Michigan, has recently issued SFBRI: SCIENCE FICTION BOOK REVIEW INDEX, 1923-1973. This reference book provides access to the book reviews which appeared in the American and British science fiction and fantasy magazines from the first issue of Weird Tales in 1923 through the magazines appearing in 1973, and provides full bibliographic detail on the books reviewed. Both cross references and a title index are provided. An appendix completely lists the magazines indexed, and provides a complete bibliographic history for each of the American and British fiction magazines.

SCIENCE FICTION BOOK REVIEW INDEX 1923-1973 includes all the data found in the first four volumes of the annual SFBRI, which covered the years 1970-1973. The 438 page volume is priced at \$45.00, and is available from Gale Research Company Book Tower, Detroit, Michigan 48226, or through your local bookstore.

SFBRI, volume 5, 1974, provides access to 2260 reviews of 1310 books.

INTRODUCTION

SCIENCE FICTION BOOK REVIEW INDEX is an annual publication designed to identify and provide bibliographic access to science fiction and fantasy book reviews, and to other books of potential interest to students and readers of science fiction and fantasy. To achieve that goal, most of the commercial science fiction and fantasy magazines are indexed comprehensively. The few exceptions are the exclusively reprint magazines which do not carry book reviews. In addition, certain amateur publications (fanzines) are comprehensively indexed for science fiction and fantasy book reviews. Choice of fanzines for inclusion is based on such factors as quality of reviewing and availability. Finally, a number of general magazines and library-oriented magazines are indexed selectively. In this context, "selectively" indicates that all science fiction and related reviews from each issue of the magazine are cited. Since not all general and library-oriented magazines could be covered, titles were chosen primarily for high density of reviews per issue, or because the magazine regularly reviewed science fiction and fantasy books. In all categories, the editor will welcome suggestions for additional titles to be covered. A directory of the magazine titles regularly indexed is provided in each volume.

SFBRI covers all levels of books, from children's fantasy through technical books, which were reviewed in the source journals. The primary source of reviews of children's fantasy is the "Lilliputia" column in Luna Monthly. The column is indexed completely, for two reasons. First, this aspect of the genre has long been neglected, although it might well have a significant influence on later reading habits. Consequently, citations to one of the major reviewing sources may have significant research value in the future. Second, children's librarians have few review sources which cover this type of literature, and access to reviews should be of value in selection of materials for libraries.

History and criticism, bibliography, and reference works on science fiction are included in SFBRI. Reviews to this type of material are cited wherever found, even though the magazine carrying the review is not normally indexed in SFBRI. The inclusion of such citations does not imply that SFBRI gives adequate access to the science fiction material reviewed in those titles. Technical books and popularized science books are sometimes cited, if, in the opinion of the editor, they are of potential interest to index users. The prime examples of this type of work are Isaac Asimov's many non-fiction books, ranging from spaceflight to Shakespeare.

SFBRI is divided into two sections. Section I is an alphabetical listing by author. Multiple titles by a single author are alphabetized following his name. Authors' names are cited as they were included in the reviewing source; no pseudonym cross references are provided. In the case of obvious errors, a correction has been made, with the correction verified through some reliable source. Citations in the author section consist of the following items, which appear in the citation in the order listed: author, title and subtitle; publisher; source journal; volume number or issue whole number; pagination of review; date of review; reviewer (if identified). Citations to the source journals are abbreviated, following standard abbreviations whenever possible. Full bibliographic data on the books reviewed is not provided in the annual volumes; this data will be in cumulated volumes which will update SFBRI: SCIENCE FICTION BOOK REVIEW INDEX 1923-1973, and will match the data found in that volume.

Section II is a title index to the books reviewed. The title index is truncated in several ways. The title only is given, with subtitles deleted unless essential to identify the work. The user is referenced to the author or editor's name. In the case of co-authors or co-editors, only the person under whose name the book is filed is given in the title index.

Entries in the author section are filed under the first author's name. Co-authors are disregarded in filing. Abbreviations such as "Dr." are filed as if they were spelled out in full, as "Doctor". Likewise, numbers are filed as if

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spelled out. An exception must be noted here. Serial publications, such as Orbit 1, Orbit 2, etc., are filed numerically, rather than by number spelled out.

SFBRI annuals are not designed to be accurate bibliographic records of the books cited, although every effort is made to correct errors. Almost every author and title entry is derived from secondary sources, and errors may be carried over to this index. Also, since some of the source journals carry prepublication reviews, there is always the possibility of a blind entry, resulting either from nonpublication of the book, or a last-minute title change on the part of the publisher. The editor would be grateful for any additions or corrections to this index, to improve the accuracy of future cumulations.
